7. Discussion of Committees, Goals & Priorities for 2025

Matt Berry reviewed the structure and responsibilities of the four committees adopted in 2024:

- a) Executive Committee

Discussion was held on whether any other Committees should be formed, including a Governance Committee that would investigate alternative forms of Municipal Government. It was generally agreed that new Committees could be formed throughout the year as work progressed, especially the County Feasibility Study.

- Current Committee Chairs will schedule and convene an organizational meeting for each Committee in January.
- The Executive Committee is composed of the elected officers and the Chairs of the other Committees.
- The Treasurer is the designated Chair of the Finance Committee.

- Other Committees will elect a Chair (who must be a member of the Steering Committee) at their
 organizational meetings, along with any other task leaders or officers that they approve.
- The Committees will be responsible for setting out a work program and to be prepared to report to the Steering Committee every month and to present a key summary report at the Quarterly Association Meetings.

- 9. Detailed comparison of 2025 property taxes paid by County residents vs. City (Blaine, Lynden, Ferndale)
- 10. Outreach to HOA's (with presentations)
- 11. Speakers Group to present at HOA's and other stakeholder opportunities
- 12. Pledge cards for Steering Committee members and other association members
- 13. Survey to gauge preferred municipal services using Survey Monkey
- 14. Calendar of Community events for Information Booth
- 15. List of potential sources for Financial Grants
- 16. Potential of using Social Media (pros/cons)

8. New Business

a) Birch Point Annexation

Patrick Alesse noted that the City of Blaine had proposed new annexations west and south of Semiahmoo which broke a long-held agreement that they would not annex in the Birch Point area south of a westerly extension of Lincoln Road. Several residents of Birch Bay have attended Blaine Council meetings to protest the proposed annexation. It was agreed that the BBIA should not take a position on the proposed annexation to protect the neutral position of investigating the feasibility of incorporation. However, individual members of BBIA, including Steering Committee Members, should be able to take a position on the proposed annexation without having a conflict of interest.

Birch Bay Community Advisory Committee

Discussion was also engaged on representatives to the new Birch Bay Community Advisory Committee (BBCAC) recently adopted by County Council and representations to the current update of the Whatcom County Comprehensive Plan. It was agreed that the BBIA should not take a position on these issues to protect the neutral position of investigating the feasibility of incorporation, but individual members of BBIA, including Steering Committee Members, should be able to take personal positions including being a member on the BBCAC without having a conflict of interest.

b) Boundary Change

Matt Berry proposed that the Preliminary Boundaries of Incorporation should revert from the 2008 boundaries of the UGA to the current Birch Bay UGA boundaries. After some discussion, it was agreed that the issue would be considered later in the year when the Feasibility Study is completed which hopefully could consider the impacts within both boundaries for evaluation.

c) City Hall

Matt Berry noted that it had been suggested that the building at 8097 Harborview Rd. (Birch Bay Family Medicine) could be considered for a Birch Bay City Hall. The idea was considered premature since a decision on potential Birch Bay Incorporation has not been made.
